Our focus is on the County's Open Space Preserves, but we will visit other public lands as well.

We will transport you by van – or meet you at the Trailhead if you choose – walk on easy trails, talk about how the lands were saved, introduce you to plants and wildlife, and enjoy a light snack. Van capacity is 20, and reservations are required for all participants.

Hamilton Wetland Restoration Project

After decades of preparation, the former 750-acre Hamilton Air Field was opened to Bay tides in 2014 for the first time in 100 years. Enjoy views across the restored wetlands from the easy and pleasant Bay Trail.
